To Our Residents' Family Members:

All residents and staff remain negative for COVID-19. Residents are monitored daily for signs and symptoms, and staff are tested weekly. We continue to take precautions by restricting visitation and maintaining clean and sanitary conditions.

Indoor visitation will begin on Monday November 16, 2020. We are slowly introducing this policy. To start, we will be offering timeslots of 11am and 3pm daily for indoor visitation in the vestibule off the main lobby. Two people can attend per visit per resident, and masks must be worn at all times. We're sorry, but no children or pets are permitted to visit. There will be a plastic divider between the resident and visitor(s). A staff member will be present during the visit, which will be about 15-20 minutes in length. Visitors will be required to fill out a symptom questionnaire and have their temperature taken prior to the visit starting. You will also be given a list of Core Principles on the first visit that must be followed, or you may be asked to leave the visitation area. We ask that you schedule the indoor visits at least 48 hours ahead of time. If you have already signed an informed consent for outdoor visitation, you do not need to sign one for indoor visitation. If you have not yet signed a consent, you will need to do so prior to scheduling your first indoor visit. You can contact Stephanie for the informed consent form.

Outdoor visitation will remain available as weather permits. Regulations for outdoor visits are still the same: two visitors at a time, must be masked, must be six feet apart, 15-20 minutes in length, scheduled at least 24 hours in advance, and symptom questionnaire filled out and temperature taken prior to visit.
