To Our Residents' Family Members:

All residents and staff are negative for COVID-19. Residents are monitored daily for signs and symptoms. We are following all state guidelines and protocols. Unvaccinated staff are tested twice weekly according to county infection rates and NJ guidelines for the virus.

Visiting hours are open from 9am to 5pm daily. When you visit your loved one, you must follow the **Core Principles** of COVID-19 infection prevention. Please wear a face shield and mask that covers your nose and mouth during the entire visit and use hand sanitizer at the desk when signing in. We will be screening all visitors prior to the visit starting. If any visitors are feeling sick or have symptoms of COVID-19, we ask that they visit another time when they are feeling better. The COVID-19 cases in Middlesex County are beginning to increase again which is why we are taking further precautions.

If you have traveled or plan to travel out of state or country recently, we are asking that you do not visit for a few days after your return home to monitor yourself for signs or symptoms of COVID-19. Or we ask that you inform us of your travels so that we may give you a COVID-19 rapid antigen test.

As Mother's Day is approaching, we are asking that you be considerate of when you visit and how many people visit at one time. Please spread out your visits throughout the week as much as possible so that we do not have crowds of people in the facility. Also, we ask that two people visit at one time. As always, we recognize how important your visits with your loved one are to them and to you. We will do everything we can to keep your loved one safe and ask that you do the same by following our protocols.
